

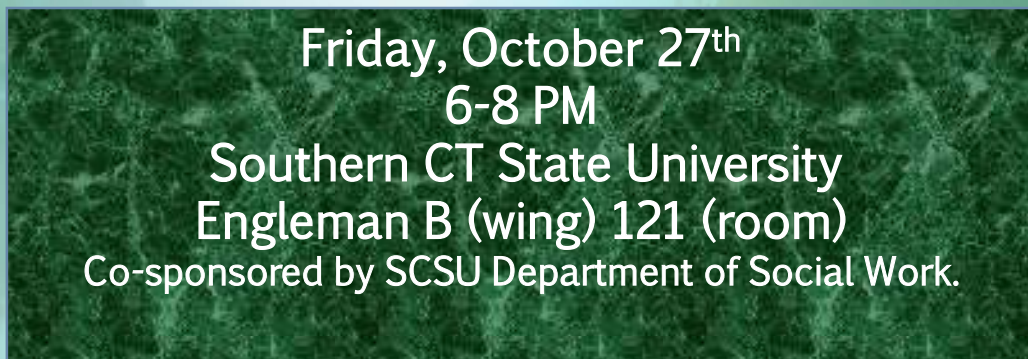
## The NASW Clinical Social Work Network Presents the third in a series of Town Hall meetings asking the question:
